Dad was gone most of the time due to life in prison when I was 13. But He did teach me how to play baseball and show me the things a Dad shows a son. I played Baseball most of my childhood but when I was 12, I turned to gang life because that was what was around me. My house or home was the place where everyone hung around so it wasn't so much as a choice but just something I was raised into. And when I looked around for guidance, it was the

homeboys I looked to. It wasn't bad and it wasn't good—they were just my family that I grew up in. It wasn't long until I started using alcohol and drugs and living s life of crime. Then at the age of 15 ½ I was off to the YA to start my first 2 years of 12 ½ years I would spend behind bars. I won't go into that part of my life because it is a part of my life I don't glamorize but the one thing I will boast in is that on my last year I was so tired of that life that I came to my senses and cried out to the Father and accepted my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. When I was releases I did live a life worthy to call a Christian life for eight years and I wish my story ended there, but that just started a new chapter in my life that I am still playing out here at Set Free.
